Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 11th July 2023

Public participation

A member of the public raised concerns about a problem with feral cats on a piece of land in the village. At their own expense, a group of neighbours had been attempting to catch the cats and get them neutered at the vets.
